



FebruaryBOOK REVIEW

This month we reviewed 'Unsheltered' by Barbara Kingsolver.

Ms Kingsolver is a very popular author with our club, so many of us are familiar with her other works.

The technique she has used in this particular novel has us swinging chapter by chapter from the immediately post Obama family in a teetering 19th Century house in Vineland, New Jersey, to the 19th Century when the same house, less substantial than it looks, but a new build in a budding Vineland is inhabited by another fictional family.

Needless to say the switches are bewildering, and at times tiresome. The club had two 9 and the rest were mediocre.

Miss Kingsolver's salvation lies in her excellent writing and character drawing. If each story is taken on its own merits then we have two books in one here - tied together via the insubstantial shelter.

In the 19th century the author wished us to encounter a botanist, Mary Treat who has been dealt the raw hand of historical neglect because she was a woman. She also happened to be living at a stirring and dramatic time in the growth of New Jersey so just as, in the present story the Politicians are real, the events surrounding our fictional hero are very real and include a murder. One of those cases where truth is stranger than fiction, and can be more difficult to present.

In the present we are dealing with a disintegrating family and the consequences of the new kinds of families we find evolving-some of them dysfunctionally. The characters in this part of the book seem more completely drawn, as these real experiences are all around us. One of our members who had loved this book felt a great affinity for this portion of the book and despite not being at the meeting, wrote us a most compelling rant upon the topic. This took the rest of us off to some personal sagas and the topic of abandoned children came up in graphic and spell binding clarity.


Each book we read is revealing more about ourselves as humans. I am impressed, amazed and thrilled to be a member of a group with such committed human beings.

As one of the frustrated, I have borrowed a copy and will now give this a second read. I would not recommend this as Kingsolver first read. lf were concerned about disintegration of the 20th century idea of community, I'd read about the present. If I wanted to know more about early New Jersey. Mary Treat and her times, the scandalous Mr Landor plus the Darwin naysayers of the day (exactly like Climate Change naysayers of today), read the past tale. As for the combination, well - I spent a lot of time trying to stitch the two together, and perhaps I missed the potency of each standing by itself.



An Expensive Flight


