President's Report

Sharon Dun has been with Confederation Park as a member, board member, Vice President, and, in 2023, President. Very approachable and compassionate, Sharon would love to meet you if she hasn't met you yet.



Hello everyone!

I hope you have all been enjoying your summer and that you are looking forward to joining

members in our regular classes and social events. Your Board of Directors and Staff are all excited to welcome members and friends back to Confederation Park 55+ Activity Centre after the summer break.

We are currently preparing to enter into renewing our two-year lease agreement with Triwood Community Centre and there are still questions among our members such as, "Why did we move when the old building is still there?", "Will we be moving back?", or "Why is the sign still on the old building?", etc. This seems like a good time to review the circumstances and hopefully answer some questions. The location we were all used to on 13th Street NW was tied in to the adjacent Seniors Housing operated by Silvera. We paid a nominal rent to Silvera and had absolute freedom to operate as we saw fit. Unfortunately, the buildings reached the end of their useful life and the decision was made to close the buildings and relocate the residents.

The buildings are owned bν the Government of Alberta and operated by Silvera. Our lease with Silvera had a sixmonth cancellation clause and we were informed bv the Minister of Seniors Housing that the Government of Alberta would be exercising that clause and terminating our lease at our much-loved old Centre. The buildings are now vacant, all tenants relocated, and we have no idea what plans are for the buildings.

There are a few reasons why signs for Confederation Park 55+ Activity Centre have been left on the building. It would be cost prohibitive to remove them, they are advertising our website at no cost to us, and there is nothing on either of the large signs on the building saying the Centre is located in that building. There is a sign at the entrance to the parking lot saying we are located there. We did put up a notice on that sign showing our new address but, unknown to us, that overlay was removed by unknown persons.

We were fortunate to find space inside Triwood Community Centre and, although it has been a huge adjustment for staff and







Recipes FROM THE GARDEN

Jim had an awful day fishing on the lake...

"Because your wife came in earlier today and said that if you came by, I should tell you to take the golden trout. That's what she'd like for supper tonight."



- 10 slices bacon
- · 2 cups cooking apples, chopped
- 1/2 cup onion, chopped
- 1 10-oz sweet potato, peeled, in 1/4" cubes
- 2 tsp fresh thyme or 1/2 tsp dried thyme
- 1/4 tsp black pepper
- · 6 eggs, lightly beaten
- 3/4 cup milk
- 3/4 cup cheddar cheese, shredded

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray a 12 muffin cup pan with cooking spray. Cut four bacon slices crosswise into thirds; chop remaining bacon.
- Cook bacon slices over medium until crisp. Add chopped bacon, apples, and onion to skillet. Stirring occasionally, cook mixture for 5 minutes. Add sweet potato; cook 10 minutes. Stir in thyme and pepper.
- Divide mixture into muffin cups. In a bowl, combine egg and milk; pour over potato mixture (cups will be full). Top with cheese.
- 4. Bake 25 minutes or until puffed and a knife comes out clean. Cool in cups 5 minutes. Remove from cups. Top with large bacon pieces. Serve warm.

WHO QUALIFIES?

WHAT IS IN THE PANTRY?

Depending on donations, our pantry is primarily filled with non-perishable items such as pasta, cans of pasta sauces, fruits, vegetables, beans, soups, canned fish, canned ham or chicken meat, oils, dry goods, packaged foods, cereal, dry mixes and snacks (such as granola bars etc.). Small packages of pet treats and toiletries may also be available.

If you would like to make a donation to our Pantry, please make sure all food donations have NOT expired and are in small portions for one or two people. Cash donations are greatly appreciated. Bring donations to the Office on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, 10 AM - 2 PM, or at T&C on Thursdays from 1:30 PM - 2:30 PM.






